Biodiversity Builders[™] College Mentor Application Summer 2024

In the Biodiversity BuilderssM (BB) Youth Program, created and led by Belmont, MA resident Jean Devine and fiscally sponsored by the Tiny Seed Project, Inc. 501(c)3.,

Biodiversity BuildersSM (BB) is a youth-driven environmental education program created and led by Belmont, MA resident Jean Devine (Devine Native Plantings, LLC) and fiscally sponsored by the Tiny Seed Project, Inc. 501(c) 3. Jean is an environmental educator, native-plant coach, and specialty landscaper.

Biodiversity BuildersSM (BB) is an environmental education program designed to inspire and empower youth to be Earth Stewards and make an ecological impact in their communities. BB is committed to inclusion and diversity in our programming by providing an accessible, six-week, paid environmental internship to 16 high school students from Arlington, Belmont and Cambridge, who reflect a diverse range of demographics and environmental knowledge and two college mentors. Students learn how to: build and restore biodiversity and local ecosystems; identify, install, and remove native and invasive plants; design gardens using native plants; operate a business where they collectively define mission, vision and values and implement a large native plant sales event; and advocate for nature-based solutions to climate change.

As a result, youth emerge proud of their accomplishments, confident in their ability to earn a salary while advocating for themselves, their communities, and our planet, and excited to share a self-directed project that expresses their individuality.



Outdoor Educator/Mentor: 20-25 hrs/ week. June 17 - August 9 (2 positions)

@\$18/hr. (Our program runs from July 2 - August 9th, but mentors are required two weeks prior for set up etc). The program is T-Fri, but mentors will be required to work up to 5 hours outside of the program on operations, helping students with independent projects, site maintenance and more.

Responsibilities: Working in Arlington, Belmont and Cambridge, college mentors lead students to remove invasive plants and install and maintain native plant gardens. Learn about native plants, landscaping techniques, and customer and community interactions. Work with staff to shape and deliver curriculum materials and model positive peer and customer interactions. Mentors will guide students to develop independent projects, help form a business model, and run a native plant sale at the end of the session. Almost all work takes place outside through summer weather conditions including

heat/sun, humidity, and occasional rain. Some speakers will give talks inside and much of the business planning will occur indoors.

Position Requirements: Energetic and passionate about ecology and youth education. Excited about working outside/ getting your hands dirty. Experienced working with teens, and able to provide good judgment in a group setting. Participate in planning and training sessions, assist in setting up workspace/classroom. Ability to comfortably move through multiple roles. Self-motivated and works well alone and as part of a team. Environmental Science background and interest in ecological restoration helpful. Ability to carry 25 lbs, and learn as you go. Having your own vehicle is a plus.
